University of Kentucky Education Abroad & Exchanges Spotlights its Students in 2018

Lexington, Ky.—Feb. 20, 2018— Lack of finances deter students from education abroad programs, however, new scholarship opportunities for exchange programs with Education Abroad & Exchanges allows University of Kentucky students to travel the world at an affordable price.

UK EA identified cost as a barrier preventing students from studying abroad and sought to provide scholarships for exchange programs. To combat this issue, officials said they plan to award scholarships ranging from \$1,000 to \$5,000 adding up to \$40,000 total in funding for the 2018-19 academic year.

Niamh Minion, Assistant Director of EA, found her way to UK after realizing her passion for travel. Currently, she works in accord with partner programs to provide students more opportunities to study abroad.

"We wanted to create opportunities to have an affordable experience. Students pay tuition close to what they would at UK. So, I think that is why we chose to look at finding options to make it cheaper than it would be to go here at UK," said Minion.

Education abroad enables students to study, intern, teach, research or participate in service abroad. The University offers six different programs: UK faculty-directed, UK partner, UK Exchange, UK Consortia, UK Direct and UK Organization. UK EA chose to highlight exchange programs specifically for the 2018-19 academic year.

UK EA provides the opportunity to earn international credit allowing students to personalize their abroad experience. Students can select their courses, programs and destinations regardless of major. However, what turns students away is the high program costs.

Finances tend to limit the number of students participating in education abroad programs, because of this EA chose to highlight funding as an area of improvement for the 2018-19 academic year. Officials said UK EA will award scholarships on a first come, first serve basis, enticing students to apply for exchange program scholarships early.

Program fees are not the only obstacle students face when looking to study abroad, high application fees serve as an added barrier. The EA center allocated money to assist students in financing their substantial program fees as well. Starting next fall, the university allows eligible students to use their financial aid awards towards program fees. Beginning in the 2018-19 academic year, the university allows eligible students to use their financial aid awards towards program fees.

Susan Meredith, EA Advisor, Alumni Engagement and EAPA Program Coordinator, works directly with students on a daily basis. Serving as an advisor, Meredith has witnessed the frustration students feel once discovering the high cost of some exchange programs.

"Starting next fall, students can match financial aid from the Pell Grant, and use it towards their program fees. This will serve as added funding support in addition to scholarships students may receive," said Meredith.

Finances are not the only barrier preventing students from study abroad, lack of opportunity in English-speaking countries serves as an added barrier. Swansea University in Wales, United Kingdom, recently partnered with UK EA and plans to award four scholarships

worth more than \$1,000.

The new exchange program in Wales, United Kingdom, allows students to travel abroad at a low cost, while providing an opportunity to study in an English-speaking country. EA strives to offer students with opportunities to study in countries that speak English, since many exchange programs offered require an understanding of a foreign language.

"EA chose Swansea because it was another option for students to study in an Englishspeaking country. Not many programs are offered in English-speaking countries that also offer a variety of study areas, an exchange program in the UK accommodates this," said Minion.

Swansea is a top 200 university for international students offering a wide range of study areas. With more than 160,000 students from 120 countries, the British university provides a multicultural experience. Students can dive into the history of Welsh culture and learn the legend of King Arthur because of the South Wales location.

Exchanges programs similar to the one offered at Swansea University, allow students to pay UK tuition while studying internationally. The South Wales program qualifies for one of the newly offered scholarships during the 2018-19 academic year.

UK EA wants to attract new students to apply for this program since it provides a new opportunity to study in an English-speaking country, with an added possibility of receiving a \$1,000 scholarship. Minion said next year UK EA will focus on diminishing the stereotype that education abroad programs are expensive by allotting better scholarship opportunities to students.

"Once students realize that UK EA is willing to make it affordable for them to study abroad, I really believe more will apply and show interest," said Minion.
